



What's new at the HYC ?

- ⇒ The tenant's lease has been updated and signed for another year. This rental provides over \$7,000 per year toward club expenses. We maintain the property to keep a happy tenant and protect our investment and assets.
- ⇒ A new outside antenna has been installed and connected to both the River Room and Main Room televisions providing up to 35 channels (75 miles of reception), most in high definition resolution **with no monthly cost** to the club. This \$30 antenna was used during our Kentucky Derby event to display the race in the main room.
- ⇒ After careful negotiations, we arranged to have the dead tree looming over our tenant's bedroom removed. We negotiated a greatly reduced price, and due to its location on the property line, we only paid half (\$125) to have it cut down. Some of our members carried away the branches during Docks In, and the main trunk was cut into fireplace size pieces and added to our campfire firewood pile to maximize the benefits of the tree cutting cost.
- ⇒ We replaced several bad portions of the tenant's deck with pressure treated wood and fastened all loose boards to ensure safety. Ongoing maintenance such as this will prolong the life of the deck before it needs replacement.
- ⇒ The four old picnic tables with sections rotting were repaired with new wood and all have been stained red for many more years of service at a price of less than \$80 each (quite a bargain!).
- ⇒ Poison ivy was discovered around the two sheds and the ramp leading to the dock and was immediately treated to eradicate it. This treatment kills the ivy down to its roots to ensure success.
- ⇒ Thank you to all who donated flowers and plants to help beautify the HYC club and grounds. More flowers have been promised and landscaping work will continue. A large amount of weeding was done at Docks In.

THANK YOU! After the recent email was sent out about problems with logs and debris coming down the river and lodging against our docks and boats, more than 14 members committed to days and times when they came down to clear the debris. On one day, more than 8 members & family spent over 3.5 hours to clear a 50' tree. A few came down daily and one special member came down 3 times a day. WOW, what dedication!
